HIPPERHOLME SOLDIER KILLED

PTE. A. NAYLOR, NORTH LANCASHIRE'S

Mr. and Mrs. Law Broadley, of 3, Halifax Road, Hipperholme, have received official information of the death of their son, Pte.

Arthur Naylor, Loyal North Lancashire Regt. Pte. Naylor joined the colours early in the present year, and, after training at Canterbury, was drafted to France in September last. He was wounded on October 20th and died Dec.11th at the 4th General Hospital. Before entering on military service Pte. Naylor was employed by Messrs. T. F. Firth & Sons, Bailiffe Bridge, and was a member of the Hipperholme Liberal Club. He was 30 years of age.

Arthur Naylor is remembered on plot D34 of St. Matthew's churchyard, Lightcliffe.

As Arthur Naylor's baptism record above shows he was born on 12th December 1887 the son of Hannah Naylor. But he was not baptised until 29th January 1896 when he and his half-sister Hilda Broadley were baptised together at St.Matthew's Church, Lightcliffe. In the meantime, Hannah Naylor had married Law Broadley, both aged 23 and both from Bailiffe Bridge, on 12th July 1890 in Halifax.

Hannah Naylor came from a long line of Lightcliffe Naylors, many of whom had connections with St.Matthew's Church including Arthur's 2 x great uncle the Crimean soldier and a one day old namesake. Read:-

Dragoon Guard Joseph Naylor

This Joseph Naylor (13 September 1823 – 10 January 1901), the son of Samuel Naylor and Sarah Sowden, had several siblings including an older sister Mary who was baptised on 31st August 1817. 'Spinster' Mary Naylor baptised a son Henry again at St. Matthew's Church, Lightcliffe on 22nd October 1843. Hannah Naylor was Henry's daughter.

Henry Naylor, the son of Mary, married Suzy/Susie Stott on 28th August 1864 at St. John's Church, Halifax. He was a 21-year-old 'Miner' from Hipperholme who gave his father's name as 'John Naylor Plate Layer'. This was most probably his stepfather John Bell who his mother Mary had married in Elland on 21st January 1848. Twenty-year-old Suzy Stott was also from Hipperholme. Her father was Ellis Stott, a Cotton Spinner. Her mother may be the Betty Stott of Wyke buried in an unknown grave in St. Matthew's churchyard on 8th March 1864.

Henry and Suzy Naylor had three daughters before the 1871 census. They were all baptised at different churches even though their parents' address was always Bailiffe Bridge and Henry was always a 'Miner'. They went back to St. John in the Wilderness, Cragg Vale to baptise Sarah Ann (born 14th June 1866) on 5th August 1866, had Hannah baptised at St. Mary's Wyke on 7th June 1868 and then baptised Ada at St. Matthew's, Lightcliffe on 28th August 1870. Widower Ellis Stott – not Naylor as implied in the 1871 census – was with his daughter and family on census night 1871. He was buried in an unknown grave in Lightcliffe churchyard on 13th November 1877 aged 75 as his wife had probably been.

More children, Mary Ann, Harriet born 15th October 1875 and John Henry Naylor born 24th May 1878 were baptised at St. Matthew's, Lightcliffe on 6th July 1873, 6th February 1876 and 1st September 1878 respectively. But 18-month-old Mary Ann was then buried in plot B76½ - yes, the parish records actually say that – on 21st August 1874.

As already recorded, Hannah Naylor gave birth to Arthur Naylor in 1887 and then married Law Broadley in 1890. Their 1891 households looked like this.

Sarah Ann Naylor married Henry Ellis, an 'Overlooker' from Norwood Green on 4th November 1894 at St. John's, Halifax. They had a daughter Amy on 15th August 1899 who they baptised at St. Matthew's Church on 10th September 1899. Father Henry Ellis was a 'Printing Overlooker' and the family lived in Bailiffe Bridge.

Harriet Ann Naylor married Edward Weir on 1st October 1898 at St. Mary's Wyke. Edward was originally from Kilmarnock, Ayrshire.

Arthur Naylor continued to live with his grandparents and not with his mother and family. Half-sister, Hilda, and half-brother Wilfred were born on 6th October 1895 and on 16th September 1900 respectively. Hilda was baptised on 29th January 1896.

Nellie Weir was born on 5th December 1901. Her uncle John Henry Naylor married Betty Farrar on the 8th March 1902. Their daughter Florrie was born on 3rd December 1902. Cousin Ada Mary Weir was born on 22nd January 1907. Edward and Harriet Ann Weir had another child, born in the decade between censuses, that did not survive.

These girls' and Arthur's grandmother Susie Naylor died on 16th January 1907 and their grandfather, Henry Naylor, on 28th February 1909. They were both buried in plot C4 in Lightcliffe churchyard on 18th January 1907 and 3rd March 1909 respectively. It would appear from the 1911 census that Arthur then went to live with his mother, stepfather and half siblings hence the surname Broadley and not Naylor was recorded.



Ada Naylor has not been found in 1911

Arthur Naylor married Minnie Isabel Gibbs on 8th August 1912. She was the youngest daughter of George Frederick and Sarah J Gibbs.



But within a year, on 26th June 1913, Minnie Isabel Naylor had died. She was the first person to be buried in plot D34 of St. Matthew's churchyard owned by Law Broadley on 28th June 1913 but there is no memorial inscription to her on the headstone.



Arthur Naylor's half sister Hilda married Private Ernest Briggs in 1917. He appears to have transferred from the British Army into the Royal Flying Corps perhaps as a driver during WW1. There is a UK, R.A.F Airmen record for him dated 20th July 1917 and a "Disability" pension record dated 25th February 1920 when his address was given as Hipperholme, Halifax. Hilda and Ernest had a son Dennis Briggs in 1918.


Half brother Wilfred Broadley married Elsie Mears in 1927 just before his mother died on 18th January 1928. Hannah Broadley was buried in plot D34 on 21st January 1928.

When Joe and Amy Walton nee Ellis had a son in 1924 – they had married in 1923 - they named him Arthur Naylor Walton perhaps in memory of her cousin. But his namesake only survived a day before he died on 1st May 1924. He was buried in St. Matthew's churchyard in plot 1A45 on 5th May 1924.

Amy's mother Sarah Ellis nee Naylor died on 17th November 1930 and was also buried in Lightcliffe churchyard on 20th November 1930 in plot V14. Law Broadley, Arthur Naylor's step father, was buried with his wife in plot D34 on 4th July 1934. The memorial inscription is on the side of the plot and there is a probate record.

Widower Henry Ellis was living with his only daughter and her husband in 1939. When he died on 4th January 1951 twenty one years after his wife he was buried with her in plot V14 on 8th January 1951 of St. Matthew's churchyard, Lightcliffe.

WALTON Joe of 39 Birkhouse Rd Bailiffe Bridge Brighouse West Yorks died 8 March 1984 Administration with Will Leeds 9 April Not exceeding £40 000.

Harriet Ann Weir nee Naylor died in 1945, her husband Edward Weir in 1948 and their daughter Ada Mary Sparke nee Weir in 1989. Spinster daughter Nellie Weir became a centurion but only just having been born on 5th December 1901 she died on 6th December 2001.

Arthur Naylor's half siblings, Hilda Briggs nee Broadley and Wilfred Broadley, died in 1976 and 1971 respectively. There appears to be no further family connections with the churchyard.
