

The Jowett family part 1

There may be a missing ledger stone or tomb bearing the memorial inscription to Fanny and William Jowett and four young children but there are other visible family memorials.

They start with the grandfather of Frances (Fanny) Brown. Except Samuel Brown was recorded as Samuel Broune when he died on 15th November 1761 as you can read on his ledger stone. The Halifax register of Lightcliffe burials has Sam Brown



He was buried on 18th November 1761 in plot L*24 with this memorial inscription. Notice the spelling of Here / Hear – we have one or two of these! – as well as Broune for Brown.




Samuel may well have married Martha Swain on 1st July 1722 in Halifax.


A daughter of Samuel Brown, Betty, was baptised at Eastfield Chapel on 15th June 1723 and then buried in Lightcliffe churchyard on 13th November 1723. Another daughter, Martha, and then two sons may have been baptised at Coley.

One of the sons, John Brown, was baptised at St. John's Church, Coley on 6th November 1737 and is almost certainly the chap below.

Husbandman John Brown of Hipperholme married Hannah Crabtree on 13th January 1768 in Halifax. They may well have had seven children baptised at Lightcliffe but only their daughter Frances baptised at Eastfield Chapel on 7th April 1771 will now be followed.



Hannah Brown died on 7th October 1823 and was buried at Lightcliffe as the memorial inscription on the ledger stone over plot L*24 and the burial record note.

Frances Brown married William Jowett on 27th August 1792 at St. John's Church, Halifax. They had the following children baptised at St. Matthew's Church Lightcliffe; Ham on 15th March 1795, Martha on 9th April 1797, Joseph born 2nd June 1799 on 14th July 1799, William on 3rd January 1802, Ann on 8th April 1804, John on 1st June 1806, Mary on 7th December 1806, Thomas on 2nd October 1808, Jerry on 28th May 1809 and finally Jonas on 1st September 1811.

From the transcription of the missing memorial we know that four of them were :-

BETTY

HAM

WILLIAM

AND ONE IN ITS INFANCY

Ham was buried on 11th December 1796, followed within a few weeks by Betty for whom no baptism record has been found on 4th January 1797 and then one year old William on 9th January 1803. It is impossible to tell who the other Jowett infant was.

Nine-year-old John Jowett, the son of William, was buried in an unknown plot on 25th February 1816. Brother Joseph married an Ann but her surname and the date have not been confirmed. Hannah (Ann) Jowett married William Tordoff in Bradford on 8th May 1827. Their daughter Fanny was born on 17th November 1831 and then baptised on Christmas Day 1831 at Low Moor. She lost her mother in 1834 and then her father in 1844.

And then Jerry Jowett married Mary Ann Hepworth on 20th October 1833 at Birstall. They had a daughter Martha baptised at Brighouse on 2nd April 1837 when her father was an innkeeper. Just over a year later the Lightcliffe burial records record the deaths of both father and daughter within ten days of one another.

They were buried together in plot Z*7 with a ledger stone which is still visible and may provide a clue as to where the missing memorial to his parents and young siblings were buried. Arthur Blackburn numbered Jerry Jowett's inscription No 295 with his parents one numbered No 296.

Youngest brother Jonas Jowett married Phoebe Emmott on 19th May 1840 in Bradford. Nothing more has been found for brother Thomas and the sisters have not been followed.

These leads into the 1841 census data and where different members of the family were on 6th June 1841. Except as you will see sixty-five-year-old William Jowett seems to be in two households! He was probably with his son Jonas but also recorded with his wife Fanny and their granddaughter Fanny Tordoff. This sales notice offers an explanation.

No doubt this explains why William was apparently in two places at once!

On 15th May 1849 publican Jonas Jowett and his wife, Phoebe, had a son William, presumably named after his grandfather. Little William Jowett was baptised at Low Moor on 15th July 1849.

A month later his grandmother seventy-eight-year-old Fanny (Frances) Jowett née Brown died on 19th August 1849. She was buried somewhere in Lightcliffe churchyard perhaps next to her son and granddaughter in a plot with position AA*7.

Lucy Jowett the daughter of Jonas and Phoebe was baptised at Wibsey on 30th May 1852.

Then William Jowett's orphaned granddaughter married in Manchester.

Halifax Courier 28 May 1853

May 21, at the Cathedral, Manchester by the Rev. W. Wilson, M.A., Mr. Wm. Robinson, of Chester-road, Manchester, to Fanny Tordoff, grand-daughter of William Jowett, Esq., Huntack [sic] House, Lightcliffe.

Grandfather William Jowett appears to have owned land around Huntock House, as suggested by these sales notices almost twenty years apart.


Lot 2. All that other PIECE of PARCEL of GROUND, as the same is now staked out, bounded on the North by the property of Miss Walker, on the West by the Property of the said Mr. Jowett, on the South by Lot 1, and on the East by the said Highway leading from Brighouse to Lightcliffe, and containing in the Whole 734 Square Yards, be the same more or less.

Halifax Guardian 24 June 1854

Lot 1 All that Valuable PLOT of BUILDING GROUND, situate in Lightcliffe, in the said Parish of Halifax, being formerly part of a Close of Land called the Huntock, bounded on the south by the Highway leading from Brighouse to Smith House, on the north and west by Land belonging to Mr. William Jowett, and on the east by Land belonging to the Trustees of the late Charles Ratcliffe, Esq., and containing by admeasurement 1454 square yards or thereabouts, be the same more or less as the same is now in the occupation of Mr. William Jowett.

Notice that both landowners Miss (Ann) Walker and Charles Ratcliffe get a mention. Ann Jowett, the wife of Joseph Jowett, died on 1st August 1853. She was buried at Lightcliffe – but the burial record does not indicate where - and remembered on the ledger stone over plot L*24. This was where her husband's paternal grandparents were buried with the inscription which began with her husband's great grandfather Samuel Brown.

Her daughter Martha married Thomas Stansfield on 7th February 1854 in Elland. Their daughter Annie was born 24th February 1856 and son James on 6th April 1859. Both children were baptised at Brighouse on 9th November 1856 and 23rd September 1860.

When William Jowett of Laverock Lane died on 24th August 1857 he was buried presumably with his wife on 28th August with the missing memorial which began :-

IN MEMORY OF FANNY WIFE OF WILLIAM JOWETT OF HUNTOCK HOUSE LIGHTCLIFFE WHO DIED AUGUST 19TH 1849 Aged 78 years

Also of the above WILLIAM JOWETT who died August 24^{TH} 1857 in the 86TH year of his age.

Was this memorial inscription on a chest or table tomb rather than a flat ledger stone? William Jowett was clearly a house and landowner. Did he own two adjacent plots in Lightcliffe churchyard, one (blue oval) where his son Jerry and his granddaughter Martha were buried and then next to it (red oval) where his wife and then he were buried?

The stone at the top of the red oval is unmarked so it is not a ledger stone. Was this the base stone for the Jowett table or chest tomb? We will probably never know.

Joseph Jowett's eldest daughter Jane Butterfield and her husband, Joseph had a large family. Two-year-old Frank Stansfield was buried in Brighouse on 16th November 1862 probably at the church he was baptised at on 23rd September 1860. But years later he would be remembered in Lightcliffe churchyard.
