The Bentleys of Northowram




These two almost identical headstones are in the middle section of the churchyard just off the main path by the Till Carr Lane gateway. The one on the left is for a Sucksmith family, the other is for some Bentleys. Only when researching the Sucksmiths did it become clear that the two families were related. Elizabeth Sucksmith née Bentley and Walter Bentley the first names on each headstone were sister and brother. Their parents were James Bentley and Hannah Bentley née Chew who married in Birstall on 21st October 1824.

This is their family in the 1841 and 1851 censuses.

James Bentley died on 18th September 1850 and was buried in the United Reformed Chapelyard in Northowram. Other members of the family would also be buried there.

But it will be the siblings Elizabeth, Walter and William Henry Bentley whose story will now be followed as their names appear on the Lightcliffe headstones pictured above.




Elizabeth Bentley was baptised at St.John's, Halifax on 14th November 1830 when her father James was a stone delver. No baptism records have been found for Walter born Q3 1842 and William Henry Bentley born Q3 1846. All three were still at home on 7th April 1861.


Not long after the 1861 census was taken Elizabeth Bentley married James Sucksmith. Their story continues in the article :-

William Henry Bentley married Mary Ann Taylor on 14th February 1865 in St. John's Church, Halifax.



Before the next census they had a daughter Susan baptised at St. Matthew's Church, Lightcliffe on 13th April 1867 and then a son Harry born 9th April 1870.




Elizabeth Sucksmith née Bentlev was at Yew

Trees with her husband and family.



Walter Bentley married Charlotte Pacy at Holy Trinity, Huddersfield on 5th February 1872.

Their daughter Edith was baptised in Halifax on 25th May 1873 and then their son James was baptised at Lightcliffe on 3rd October 1875.

Their aunt, Walter's sister, Elizabeth Sucksmith née Bentley died on 19th October 1876. She was buried in Lightcliffe churchyard in plot C11 on 24th October 1876. Details of the memorial inscription on this the left-hand headstone in the image above have already been recorded.

Less than a year later her brother Walter died on 18th August 1877. He was buried in plot C12 next to his sister, on 22nd August 1875. As you can see at the time the plot was owned by his wife Charlotte Bentley. Being from a family of stone merchants probably explains the two 'twin' headstones.

Unfortunately, there are some grey stains running down this headstone making the names and dates difficult to read. A full transcription is recorded later.


Walter's brother, stone merchant William Henry Bentley, and his family including two more sons were at Hill Top, Lightcliffe in1881. Irvin was born Q4 1871 and Herbert Q3 1873. By 1891 19-year-old Irvin Bentley, a quarryman, and his wife Sarah Hannah Bunny were living next to his parents, they had married Q4 1890.

Herbert Bentley's name is the next one on the headstone above plot C12. He died on 12th July 1892 aged 19 years and was buried three days later.



Two years later his mother Mary Anne Bentley née Taylor died on 26th February 1894. She was also buried in plot C12 on 1st March 1894. By then her husband William Henry Bentley owned the plot.



[The Arthur Blackburn transcription of the memorial inscription for this headstone has the surname BRIGGS and not BENTLEY for Mary Anne's husband and a wrong death year of 1924. There is a BRIGGS headstone nearby so Mr Blackburn can be excused this untypical error.]

Three years later, in 1895, William Henry Bentley married a widow Georgina Turner and by 1901 they were living in County Clare, Ireland.

He was living in Cain Lane, Southowram with his wife Amy née Chester and their four-year-old son Percy Bentley. They would later move to Southport, Lancashire where Harry Bentley was a stone merchant. He died there on 15th November 1948.

Long before then his father died in Ireland as this newspaper report explains.

Brighouse News 1 July 1904

DEATH OF MR. W. H. BENTLEY. - The news of the death of Mr. William Henry Bentley, a former resident of Hipperholme caused much surprise in the district on Wednesday morning. The deceased, who was close upon 58 years of age, was very well known, having for a great part of his life been identified with the local stone quarries, He was for some years a partner in the old firm of Gomersall, Bentley and of Hill Top Quarries. He left Butterfield, Hipperholme to take up his residence in Liscanner, County Clare, Ireland, about ten years ago. Some fifteen months ago he underwent an operation in Dublin for a cancer in his neck, and came out apparently successful, but three weeks ago the cancer returned, and he was confined to bed. Death took place on Tuesday, and he was interred yesterday. He leaves a widow and three children to mourn his loss, Of local associations he was connected with the Golden Fleece Sick Club.

Although he was buried in Ireland, he was remembered in Lightcliffe on the family headstone in St.Matthew's churchyard.



His daughter Susan Bentley remained with the Brierley family until at least 1921. Her death, on 2nd May 1934, was recorded in the Halifax district so it looks as if she returned to the area at some point. Sixty-eight-year-old Susan Bentley was buried with her mother in plot C12 on 5th May 1934. The plot was then declared to be full. Someone added the final wording to the memorial inscription.
