## The Sucksmith family of Underhill Farm

Not long after the1921 census was taken Sarah Ann Booth née Sucksmith died on 22<sup>nd</sup> August 1921. The sixty-eight-year-old became the first occupant of Lightcliffe plot I83 when she was buried there on 25<sup>th</sup> August 1921. This plot is in the middle section of the churchyard but close to the wall near the new section. Two years later her husband William Booth joined her on 25<sup>th</sup> July 1923. He died on 22<sup>nd</sup> July 1923 aged 72 years according to his memorial inscription, but the parish record says he was 71 years.

Their eldest son, James, was also buried in this plot on 29<sup>th</sup> March 1928. He died on 26<sup>th</sup> March 1923 as his probate record states.

BOOTH James of Underhill Farm Norwood Green Halifax died 26 Marcy 1928 Administration London 22 September to Jacob Booth farmer and Ernest Booth dyer. Effects £714 8s 2d

Meanwhile his brother Edward Booth married Mary Elizabeth Brook Q1 1924 in the Halifax district.

Sister Fanny Booth appears to have had a son William Booth born on 16<sup>th</sup> May 1928.

Three months later the youngest Booth sister Emily of Underhill Farm, married Harold Fieldhouse on 11<sup>th</sup> August 1928 at St. John's Church, Coley.

When the eldest sister Mary Hannah Booth died on 13<sup>th</sup> September 1931 she was buried with her parents and brother in plot I83 on 16<sup>th</sup> September. The plot has a headstone which is now laid flat and is difficult to read.

ALSO OF MARY HANNAH DAUGHTER OF THE ABOVE WHO DIED SEP 13TH 1931 AGED 49 YEARS Mary Sucksmith, the last surviving Sucksmith, died aged eighty on Christmas Eve 1934. She was buried with her parents in Lightcliffe plot Q65 on 29<sup>th</sup> December 1934.



Ernest Booth's mother-in-law, Emma Rogers née Booth, died on 12<sup>th</sup> April 1936 aged seventy-seven. She was buried in plot S10 with her husband Lewis on 15<sup>th</sup> April 1936.



Ernest Booth's twin sister Annie married John Schofield Q3 1938, the marriage being registered in the Calder district. Their brother Fred must also have married before the 1939 register was taken but no marriage record has been found.

The data from the 1939 register and then some probate records let you know what happened to some of the family members. Notice how many of them were still living at or near Underhill Farm, Norwood Green. There are still some more family burials in Lightcliffe to come!

Ernest Booth's name was added to the side of his in laws'plinth when he was buried with them in plot S10 on 25<sup>th</sup> April 1950.

The following probate records for the Booth brothers of Norwood Green let you know when they died.

BOOTH Edward of 35 Watford-avenue Norwood Green near Halifax died 11 March 1945 Probate Llandudno 24 April to Mary Elizabeth Booth widow. Effects £1132 13s 5d

BOOTH Fred of Fair Croft Village-street Norwood Green near Halifax died 19 October 1948 Probate London 14 March [1949] to Jacob Booth retired farmer. Effects £1742 19s 7d

BOOTH Jacob of 2 Rookes-lane Norwood Green Yorkshire died 1 January 1951 Probate London 31 December to Sydney Hammond Cross surveyor and Elsie Booth spinster. Effects £25 No other brothers from this Booth family were buried in St. Matthew's churchyard but a brother-in-law, twin Annie's husband, John Schofield was.

From Halifax Evening Courier 30 June 1952

SCHOFIELD – On June 29, 1952 at 147 Bradford Road, Brighouse, John aged 79 years, the dearly loved husband of Annie Schofield. Service and interment at Lightcliffe Church, Wednesday July 2, at 3 pm. Friends please accept this intimation.

John Schofield was buried in the new section of the churchyard referred to as 'New Yard' in the parish records in a plot with code NY T5. The barely readable memorial inscription on the kerb edge says



## JOHN SCHOFIELD DIED JUNE 29TH 1951 AGED 79 YEARS

Then three years later a Booth sister, Emily Fieldhouse, was buried at Lightcliffe, in plot Q65. Her name is just visible at the bottom of the now laid flat Sucksmith headstone. Emily and her husband Harold Fieldhouse divorced in February 1952. Perhaps that explains why after her death on 23<sup>rd</sup> October 1954 she was buried on 27<sup>th</sup> October 1954 with her Sucksmith grandparents and her aunt, Mary Sucksmith, who she had lived close to.



Presumably the memorial inscription gave further details but as you can see it snapped off probably when the headstone fell over. But at least we have Emily's name and now know her relationship to the other people named on the headstone.

The last entry listed below is for Annie Schofield née Booth, the widow of John Schofield.

Although the entry appears to suggest that she was buried in plot T5 on 5<sup>th</sup> April 1956 this is almost certainly the plot in the new section NY T5 where her husband John Schofield was buried.



John Schofield's memorial inscription is on the right-hand side kerb stone above following on from the inscription on the top kerb **IN MEMORY OF** 

which presumably his widow Annie Schofield had done.

However, there is no inscription for Annie Schofield née Booth even though there was room on the left-hand side kerb stone. Perhaps there was no one to organise this after she died.

The last family memorial is for Lottie Booth, the widow of Annie's twin brother Ernest Booth. The parish record below indicates that she was buried at Lightcliffe but it is unclear as to where as the grave number was not entered.

But wherever Lottie Booth née Rogers was buried in the churchyard she was remembered on her parents memorial cross on the opposite side of the plinth to her husband's memorial inscription.



BOOTH, Lotty otherwise Lottie of 306 Wakefield Rd Bailiffe Bridge Brighouse West Yorks died 11 August 1974 Administration Leeds 24 September £10906

This concludes the Lightcliffe connections of the Sucksmith and then Booth families who farmed Underhill Farm in Norwood Green.
