The Sternwhite family part 2

Continuing the story of the Sternwhites with Lightcliffe connections.

Shoemaker Joseph Sternwhite and his Manchester born wife Emma Sternwhite née Williamson had a daughter Lily baptised at St. Matthew's Church on 3rd December 1861, just before she died. The infant was buried in an unknown plot in Lightcliffe churchyard on 7th December 1861. And then her mother Emma died aged just 28 years. She too was buried in an unknown plot on 20th January 1863. Joseph Sternwhite then married Eliza Drake on 16th January 1865.

Not long after, his mother, the widow Ann / Nancy Sternwhite, died aged 72 years. As for her husband Samuel Sternwhite she was buried in an unknown plot on 23rd February 1866.

Joseph and his second wife Eliza did not have long together as he died on 12th July 1868. Three days later he was buried in Lightcliffe churchyard in plot S67 which eventually got the headstone below. His wife Eliza Sternwhite owned the plot. This no doubt explains why her sister Sarah Firth née Drake, baptised at St. Matthew's Church on 3rd March 1805, and then Sarah's daughter Emma Drake, also baptised there on 6th January 1833, were also buried there and named on the headstone.

Sarah and Eliza Drake were two of the many children of William and Martha Drake of Hill Top. Not surprisingly the Drake family have more Lightcliffe connections but their full story will have to wait.



Meanwhile his older brother William and his wife Susy had three more children. Sam born 19th December 1863 was baptised with his sister Fanny on 24th November 1867. John born 13th August 1867 was probably also baptised with his brother and sister although the record says 21st November 1867. And Alice born 6th March 1870 was baptised again at Brighouse on 10th July 1870. Little John Sternwhite died on 3rd September 1868 and was buried three days later in Brighouse.

By 1871 the only two Sternwhite households with Lightcliffe connections were those of uncle Edwin and his nephew William although as the youngest in one generation and then the eldest in the next they were born just six years apart.

Sixty-nine-year-old Edwin Sternwhite died in Halifax on 3rd March 1886. He was brought back to Lightcliffe for burial in plot S68, next to his nephew Joseph, on 9th March 1886.

There is a probate record. Edwin Sternwhite appears to have been a relatively successful Halifax grocer / tea dealer. His name appears on 1877 subscribers' list for the purchase of "Assembly Rooms for Halifax General Infirmary" and on an "Indian Famine Relief Fund".

The Will of Edwin Sternwhite late of 25 Cromwell-terrace Halifax in the County of York Gentleman who died 3 March 1886 at Halifax was proved in Wakefield by John Morris Brown of 37 Alconbury-road Upper Clapton in the County of Middlesex Insurance Clerk Charles Sternwhite of Brighouse in the County of York Farmer the Nephew and Joseph Crowther of Halifax Grocer the Executors. Personal Estate £2,864 3s 7d

William and Susey's son, another Sam Sternwhite, married Norfolk born Mary Ann Solomon in Q3 1887. Their daughter Eva was born 28th December 1888.

Not long after the census was taken, Mary Sternwhite née Carlton died. According to the headstone this was on 15th July 1891. However, the parish burial records state that the 76 year old – the 1891 census age is therefore wrong - died on 16th and was buried on 20th July

1891 with her husband Edwin in Lightcliffe plot S68.

Sam and Mary Ann Sternwhite had two more children, Susan born Q1 1892 and William born 19th August 1893. Four-year-old Susan was buried in Brighouse on 28th January 1897.

When their paternal grandfather William Sternwhite died on 19th May 1896, he was buried in plot S68 of St. Matthew's churchyard on 2nd June 1896.

Just a few weeks after the census was taken 39-year-old Sam's wife, Mary Ann Sternwhite née Solomon died on 29th April 1901, she was buried in Brighouse.

Alice Sternwhite who was mentioned at the start of this article married Edward Cordingley Q1 1903. He had an interesting up bringing as detailed in the write up about

Alice and Edward remained close to her Sternwhite family and lived in the area so they will continue to be followed.

Alice's mother Susey Sternwhite became the last occupant of Lightcliffe plot S68 on 18th March 1905. And so, the uncle and nephew, who were actually quite close in age, and their wives were buried together. The images below show the headstone before and after some ivy had been cleared. Unfortunately, the stone on the front face is deteriorating although you can still see that the first name on it is **EDWIN STERNWHITE**.



The student William Sternwhite became a teacher. He was an assistant master in three schools in Darlington, Co. Durham before the outbreak of WW1 during which he joined the Royal Navy on Tyneside. According to U.K Naval records he served on three ships before being invalided out on 5th December 1917.



On 24th December 1921 the schoolmaster, William Sternwhite, married Anne Ward at St.Matthew's Church Lightcliffe.



Fanny Sternwhite died on 20th November 1925. The parish burial records indicate that she was buried in Lightcliffe on 24th November 1925 but do not state where in the churchyard.

Her brother Sam Sternwhite was buried in Brighouse on 20th May 1930.

Edward Cordingley, the wife of Alice Cordingley née Sternwhite, died on 24th October 1941 aged 77 years. He was buried in plot K34 in St. Matthew's churchyard on 28th October 1941. This plot is quite close to his father's Cordingley plot L37 but unfortunately it has no headstone. His widow, seventy-four-year-old Alice joined him in plot K34 - not R34 as mis transcribed - on 26th April 1944. These occupants of Ivy House Farm had probate records, in fact Alice had two.

CORDINGLEY Alice of Ivy House Farm Hove Edge Brighouse Yorkshire widow died 23 April 1944 Probate (limited to settled land) Wakefield 30 August [1946] to William Sternwhite schoolmaster and John Westman transport driver. Effects £1250. Former Grant D.R. Wakefield 6 July 1944.

By the 1950s the former resident of Ivy House Farm, William Sternwhite was the head teacher of Linton Camp Residential School, Bradford. His previous schools are listed on the certificate below. On retirement he must have moved to the Lancaster district where he died Q3 1973.

This concludes the story of the Starnwhites / Sternwhites which began with the long inscription on the early Starnwhite ledger stone (below left). Then another Sternwhite ledger stone (below right) has its memorial inscription partly covered up now. Other Sternwhites have unknown final resting places or at least known ones with no headstone. But if you look carefully to the left of the green path nearing the end of the middle section in the churchyard you will find the above two Sternwhite family headstones standing next to one another.
