
John Hemingway of Rooks part 2

Continuing the story of John Hemingway of Rooks, whose brothers Abraham and Isaac feature in Anne Lister's diaries, although John does not seem to get a mention. He and his sons were maltsters with one of the sons founding a Leeds brewery as explained in part 1.

Son George Hemingway of Lightcliffe had married Mary Haigh née Holt on 1st February 1879. When he died on 29th May 1885 aged 48 years, he was buried in plot L40 in Lightcliffe churchyard. His widow Mary died on 30th April 1890. She was buried with him on 5th May 1890 in plot L40 which now has this headstone.

The Will of Mary Hemingway formerly of 5 Park-view Lightcliffe in the Township of Hipperholme-cum-Brighouse in the Parish of Halifax but late of Westfield House Scholes in the Township of Cleckheaton in the Parish of Birstall both in the County of York Widow who died 30 April 18980 at Westfield House was proved at Wakefield by Tom Haigh of Abingdon street Toller-lane Manningham in the Parish of Bradford in the said County Worsted Mill Manager the Nephew the sole Executor. Personal Estate £507 0s 7d

Mary Hemingway's probate record states that she died at Westfield House in Scholes. This was the home of her widowed daughter in law, Abigail whose husband, Mary's son, had died in October 1888. By then Abigail Haigh née Slater had four more children as the 1891 census shows.

Although another son Charles Hemingway died in Hulme, Manchester on 8th March 1893 he was brought back to Lightcliffe for burial in plot I37 in St. Matthew's churchyard on 11th March 1893.

Both widows Betsy Hemingway and Abigail Haigh will continue to be followed for reasons that will become obvious. Betsy and her son moved back across the Pennines to Saltaire sometime before the 1901 cenus was taken. Charles Hemingway junior then seems to have worked for Sir Titus Salt in his Saltaire mill. Abigail Haigh appears to have remained in the same area if not the same house until at least 1911.

Charles Hemingway, son of Charles and Betsey, married Emily Smith on 23rd June 1920 at St. Stephen's Church, Bowling, Bradford. The households still being followed were recorded like this on 19th June 1921.

Although both Charles and Emily Hemingway gave their employer as Sir Titus Salt Sons & Co. Ltd it was noted on the census form that both were 'Out of Work'.

Abigail Haigh née Slater was buried with her husband Joseph Holt Haigh in Lightcliffe plot O41 on 8th December 1923.

She has a probate record.

HAIGH Abigail of 20 Warley-road Halifax widow died 5 December 1923 Probate London 27 December to Mary Frances Knowles (wife of John Albert Knowles) and Shaw Haigh hosier. Effects £191 8s 3d

Widow Betsy Hemingway née Sykes was also returned to Lightcliffe to be buried with her husband Charles on 25th Mary 1928 in plot I37 after she died on 20th May 1928.



Charles and Betsy Hemingway's monument is topped with a cross. Brother George and his wife have a headstone on their plot which is very similar to the Haigh headstone for Joseph Holt Haigh, Mary's son from her first marriage, and Abigail Haigh. Both memorial inscriptions have the line

IN THE MIDST OF LIFE WE ARE IN DEATH
