This article will follow Squire and Mary Jane Ingham. They lived at Birkby Lane after they were married. Three children, John Thomas born 12th May 1873, Edith Ellen born 9th March 1875 and Bertha born 27th February 1877, were baptised at St. Matthew's Church, on 1st June 1873, 2nd May 1875 and 1st April 1877 when their father was still a miner. Like his father Squire Ingham became a deputy steward at the mine. This was his occupation when another son, Randolph born 12th November 1883, was baptised on 6th January 1884, again at Lightcliffe.

Daughter Amy was born on 8th May 1886. She had a Lightcliffe baptism on 26th June 1892 with her brother Fred who was born on 20th May 1892. By then their father was a farmer.

Edith Ellen Ingham married Jabez Smith on 29th February 1896 in Dewsbury. He was a carpet yarn dyer when they had their daughter, Nellie Smith, baptised at St. Matthew's Church on 18th April 1897. But then they moved to Shropshire before the 1901 census where we will leave them.

Squire Ingham was a farmer when his eldest son John Thomas married Alice Knight on 13th March 1898. Alice, born 4th May 1879 was the daughter of another farmer, George Knight, and his wife Hannah née Webster. As the Knights were eventually buried in the churchyard their story will be told later.

Both Bertha and Randolph Ingham had 'flown the nest' before the 1911 census.

As the *Brighouse News* reported on 10th June 1904 Bertha Ingham was married at the Ebenezer Chapel in Bailiffe Bridge.

INTERESTING WEDDING: - The Ebenezer Chapel was crowded last Saturday morning on the occasion of the wedding of Mr. David Tiplady, second son of Mr. Craven Tiplady, Lightcliffe, to Miss Bertha Ingham, second daughter of Mr. Squire Ingham, Birkby Farm, Bailiffe Bridge. The bride was given away by her brother, Mr Rowland Ingham, and was attended by the following bridesmaids: Miss Amy Ingham (sister), Miss Nellie Smith (Kidderminster, niece of the bride) Miss Florence Tiplady (niece of the bridegroom), and Misses Eva and Evelyn Tiplady (sisters of the bridegroom). Mr Willie Tiplady acted as best man, and the ceremony was performed by the Rev. E. Colley. Mr. and Mrs. Tiplady, who have been the recipients of numerous useful presents, left later in the day for Ireland, where the honeymoon is being spent.

The reference to a brother Rowland would appear to be an error and should be Randolph. At first the newly married couple lived with his family in Lower Wyke and then he became a 'Fish Fryer' in Bradford.

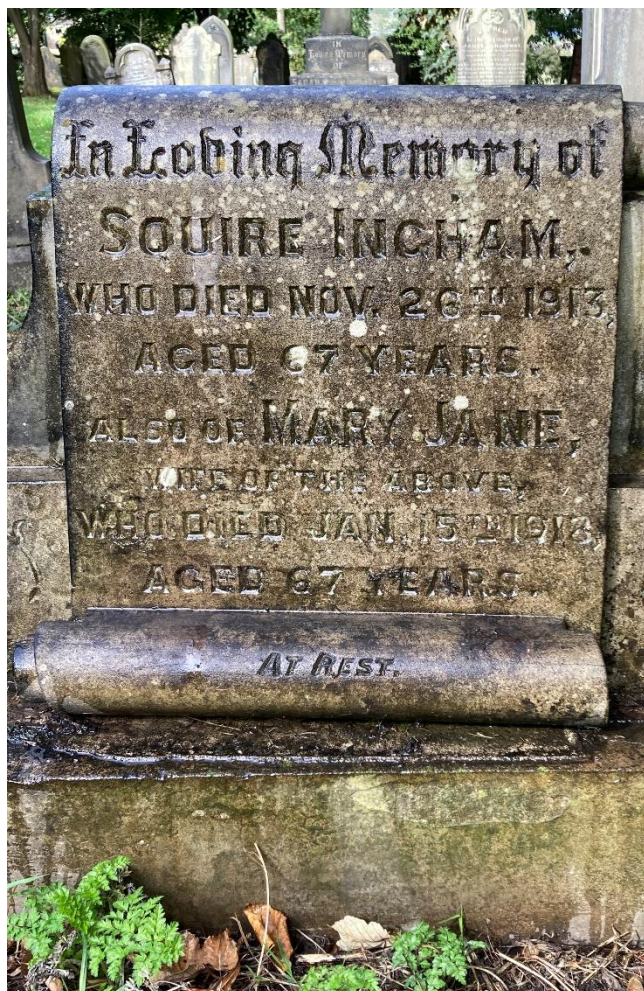

Randolph married Annie Tate on 12th September 1908 in Birkenshaw. On the 1911 census the 27-year-old commercial clerk, working for a carpet manufacturer, was living in Oakenshaw, with his wife and their 10-month-old son, Reginald. They had three more children, Emily Gwendoline born 16th January 1915, Frederick Gordon born 1918 and Norman born 16th June 1920. Three-year-old Emily died on 27th October 1918. She was buried in Brighouse Cemetery. The memorial inscription on the family headstone will be quoted later.

Squire Ingham died on 26th November 1913. He was buried in plot C76 in St. Matthew's churchyard on 29th November. The parish record shows the plot was owned by his son-in-law David Tiplady. Although it says that he was 64 years old Squire Ingham was 67 years of age as the memorial inscription correctly states.

Fred Ingham married Annie Goodyear on 18th May 1919 at St. John's Church, Coley. He was a carpet weaver who, like his older brothers, worked for T.F. Firths & Sons Ltd at their Clifton Mills in Bailiffe Bridge. Sister Amy Ingham also worked there as a 'Carpet Designer's Copyist'. Nephew Walter Ingham, having served and survived WW1, married Nellie Watson on 2nd October 1919 at the Moravian Chapel in Wyke.

Married son Walter Ingham, a railway shunter with his wife and baby daughter, was with his in-laws in Lower Wyke.

Bertha and David Tiplady were in Bradford where he was 'Fish Fryer'.

35-year-old Amy Ingham lived alone at 4 West Street, Bailiffe Bridge and worked at the Clifton Mills.

Thirty-nine-year-old Amy Ingham of Coley married a widower Percy Allatt of Rastrick on 12th December 1925. He was described as a 'Confectioner's Weighman' and had previously been married to Lilian Hirst. They married on 22nd May 1915 during the Great War in which Percy enlisted with the Duke of Wellingtons (West Riding) Regiment on 8th December 1915. On 3rd May 1917 he sustained a shrapnel wound in his right calf for which he spent time in a Norwich hospital. He was eventually transferred to Class Z Reserves on 27th February 1919 before being finally discharged when the reserve was abolished on 31st March 1920. A daughter Eileen Allatt was born in 1919 and appears on the 1921 census.

John Henry Allatt was born on the 4th March 1922. His mother was buried on 27th April 1925 in West Yorkshire. She left two young children who then got a stepmother Amy Ingham.

But back tracking, the Allatt family story will be told as they have Lightcliffe connections.

The Allatt story

Percy Allatt was the son of cabinet maker John William Allatt, born 29th March 1857 in Halifax, and his wife Miranda Drake, born in 1858, who had married in July 1878. The couple were recorded as living on Hartshead Moor Road, Clifton on the 1881 census. Francis Arthur Allatt was born on 17th August 1881, followed by Annie Elizabeth on 13th October 1883, Percy on 23rd January 1887 and then Clara on 26th December 1889. On 5th April 1891, John William Allatt and his family lived on Hartshead Moor.

But then there must have been a problem within the family as from 31st May to 19th June 1893 Miranda Allatt is listed as being in the Gibbet Street Workhouse in Halifax with her children Francis Arthur, Annie Elizabeth and Percy. Clara was most probably with them, but a page of the register has been lost. Miranda would have been pregnant as Emily was born a few months later on 4th September 1893. A year later Emily and three of her older siblings were baptised together at St. Matthew's Church in Lightcliffe. The parish record notes that by then the cabinet maker and his wife lived in nearby Norwood Green.

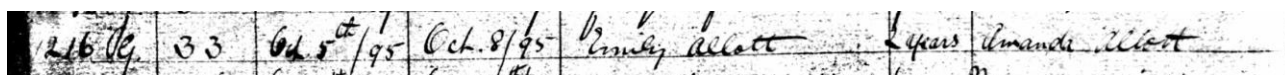

Later that year James William Allatt was sentenced to 14 days in a West Yorkshire prison because of a 'Civil Debt'. His prison record says that he served from 27th October to 8th November 1894. It also notes that he was a 'Methodist' and had lost one finger, probably not all that surprising for a cabinet maker.

Matters got worse for the family as the *Brighouse News* reported on 2nd February 1895.

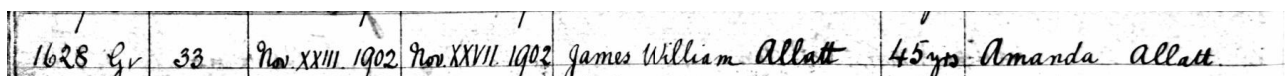
A NORWOOD GREEN WIFE-BEATER SENT TO GAOL. - On Saturday, at the Halifax West Riding Police Court, James William Allatt, of Norwood Green, described as a cabinet maker, was summoned by his wife Miranda Allatt, charged with having assaulted her on the previous Saturday. Complaint gave evidence that she had been left in the house along with her five children, without anything to eat. She accepted the invitation of Mrs Learoyd, a neighbour, to partake of supper, and while she was thus absent her husband arrived home. When she made her appearance, he seized her by the head, nearly choking her. He at the same time threatened to kill her. Being afraid of her husband, who had previously ill-used and threatened her, she ran out and passed the night at Mrs Learoyd's house. Superintendent Varly informed the Bench that defendant was a drunken, worthless fellow, too idle to follow his trade. He did not appear, and the magistrates sentenced him to one month's hard labour, with the option of a fine, obtained at the instance of the Guardians, for neglecting his wife and family.

Later that year on 5th October 1895 two-year-old Emily Allatt died. She was buried in St. Matthew's churchyard in Lightcliffe plot G33 owned by her mother Amanda (Miranda) Allatt.



Not surprisingly her parents were living apart on census night 1901 although they were both in Norwood Green. James William Allatt was alone in Chapel Place whereas Miranda and her four children were in Prospect Place. The three teenagers all worked at a carpet mill.

Then on 23rd November 1902 James William Allatt died. On 27th November 1902 he too was buried in the Lightcliffe plot, G33, that his estranged wife still owned alongside their daughter, Emily. There were no further burials in this plot which has no headstone.



Miranda and her four children were still in Prospect Place on census night 1911. The eldest son Francis was a warehouseman at a confectionary warehouse where Percy also worked as a 'Sugar Boiler'. Both daughters were weavers. By 1921 Miranda had moved with both daughters and a son-in-law to Thornhill Road Brighouse. Both daughters were now machinists, wrapping toffees for the toffee manufacturers, Turner and Wainwright, who their brothers also worked for.

The death of Miranda Allatt née Drake was recorded in the Halifax district during Q4 1930. No burial information has been found.

Now back to the **Inghams**.

The wife of John Thomas Ingham, Alice Violet née Knight, died on 22nd January 1933. She was buried in St. Matthew's churchyard in plot C83 on 25th January 1933.

These 1939 register records track most of the Inghams still living in the local area. Some of them had married and started families after the 1921 census was taken.

Walter Ingham died on 29th July 1942 and was buried in Lower Wyke Moravian Churchyard.

INGHAM Walter of 10 Laurel Bank Lower Wyke Bradford died 29 July 1942 Probate Wakefield 28 August to Nellie Ingham widow. Effects £527 9s 9d

Randolph Ingham's wife Annie died on 13th December 1942. She was buried with her baby daughter in Brighouse Cemetery. A year later her son Frederick Gordon Ingham, who served with Bomber Command, was buried with her. The *Halifax Courier* had this report on 27th August 1943.

News has been received of the death of F.O. Frederick Gordon Ingham, second son of Mr. R. Ingham and the late Mrs. Ingham, Clifton Villas, Bailiffe Bridge. F.O. Ingham joined up in September, 1939, serving in the Army Pay Corps, later transferring to the Gordons. Eventually transferring to the R.A.F., he received training in England and South Africa, returning home in January this year. An old Rastrick Grammar School boy, he was employed at the Yorkshire Penny Bank, Bradford. He had a lifelong connection with St. Aidan's Church, Lightcliffe.

It was reported that F.O. Frederick Gordon Ingham was "lost in a Vickers Wellington HE332".

INGHAM Frederick Gordon of Clifton-villas Bailiff Bridge Brighouse Yorkshire died 21 August 1943 on war service Probate Wakefield 22 November to The Yorkshire Penny Bank Limited. Effects £371 16s 6d

Other probate records are included for completeness of this Ingham family story.

No probate record has been found for thirty-four-year-old Kenneth Douglas Ingham who died on 24th January 1955. He was buried with his mother Alice Violet Ingham in Lightcliffe plot C83 on 27th January 1955. A few months later on 31st October 1955, his father would join them in this plot, which has no headstone. Eighty-two-year-old John Thomas Ingham died on 28th October 1955 as his probate record confirms.

INGHAM John Thomas of Station Cottage Birkby-lane Bailiffe Bridge Yorkshire died 28 October 1955 Administration Wakefield 30 November to Squire Ingham carpet passer. Effects £2132 5s 2d

David Tiplady died in Lancashire in 1957. It looks as if his widow then moved back to Halifax.

TIPLADY Bertha of 16 Dalehurst Heath Avenue Halifax widow died 9 September 1961 at The Royal Infirmary Halifax Probate Wakefield 4 October to Norman Ingham municipal treasurer. Effects £648 17s 7d.

Percy Allatt's death was registered in the Bury district in 1948. His widow Amy née Ingham returned to Bailiffe Bridge to live with her brother Randolph. They died within days of one another in June 1962.

INGHAM Randolph of Clifton Villas Bailiff Bridge Brighouse Yorkshire died 6 June 1962 Administration Wakefield 3 October to Reginald Ingham bank clerk and Norman chartered municipal treasurer. Effects £5342 11s

ALLATT Amy of Clifton Villas Bailiffe Bridge Brighouse Yorkshire widow died 21 June 1962 at The General Hospital Halifax Administration Wakefield 20 August to Squire Ingham carpet passer. Effects 396 4s.

Randolph was buried with his family in Brighouse Cemetery in a plot with a beautiful cross.

The memorial inscription says:-
