
Events

During the last 12 months we have been able around 30 families find graves and some of the visits have been very emotional for some family members.

Plans for 2016

- We will continue to do further clearance and recording and we have further aspects of our Heritage Lottery Fund plan to complete.
- We expect to conduct a follow up survey on the wildlife, hopefully finding evidence of a wider range than when we started. Ideally we would like to involve local school children, as the site is now safe.
- We hope to conduct a survey of the oldest part of the churchyard where we believe there are 20 or so undiscovered ledger (flat) grave markers.
- We hope to start planting wild flowers in small plots as part of a Council project to provide a path through Calderdale.
- We will be installing 3 larch seats, one alongside the tower and two along the main paths.
- We have sufficient funds to restore a few more fallen headstones.
- We will be designing and installing



some forms of interpretation of the churchyard, its history and flora and fauna.

Finance & Fundraising

In summary, our income for the year was £10,800, which, with a carry forward figure, totalled £13,000. The Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) provided £7,350 of this (the first tranche of the grant), Section 106 funding from Calderdale Council was £1,000 and the Friends concert grossed £1,875. Additional income of £500 came from the Ward Councillor Forum and a number of individual donations.

Expenditure has totalled £7,600 so far but we have commitments already made to further HLF projects. The large items of expenditure are indicated in the review of the 2015 progress.

The balance at the end of the year showed a surplus of £5,550. Some of this is HLF committed expenditure, £1,000 is FOSMC own committed funds, leaving the Friends with about £3,000 for future maintenance and sustainability.

The detailed accounts were presented at the AGM and these are in the process of being audited. Full accounts are available on request.
